

Cabin Steps

Finished size: 60" x 60"

Fabric Requirements

(Based on 40"- 42" of usable fabric. Approximately 1/8 yard 'extra' fabric added to each measurement).

Fabric 1 (Grey): 2 ¼ yards

Fabric 2 (Light Blue): ¾ yard

Fabric 3 (Medium Blue): 1 yard

Fabric 4 (Dark Blue): ¾ yard

Cutting Instructions

From **Fabric 1**, cut:

-(**30**) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub cut into (**36**) 2 ½" x 10 ½" rectangles, (**36**) 2 ½" x 8 ½" rectangles, (**36**) 2 ½" x 6 ½" rectangles, (**36**) 2 ½" x 4 ½" rectangles, and (**36**) 2 ½" squares

From **Fabric 2**, cut:

-(**5**) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub cut into (**9**) 2 ½" x 8 ½" rectangles, (**9**) 2 ½" x 6 ½" rectangles, (**9**) 2 ½" x 4 ½" rectangles, and (**9**) 2 ½" squares

From **Fabric 3**, cut:

-(**9**) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub cut into (**16**) 2 ½" x 8 ½" rectangles, (**16**) 2 ½" x 6 ½" rectangles, (**16**) 2 ½" x 4 ½" rectangles, and (**16**) 2 ½" squares

From **Fabric 4**, cut:

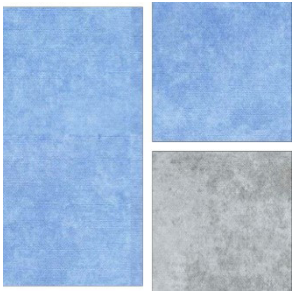
-(**7**) 2 ½" x WOF strips, sub cut into (**11**) 2 ½" x 8 ½" rectangles, (**11**) 2 ½" x 6 ½" rectangles, (**11**) 2 ½" x 4 ½" rectangles, and (**11**) 2 ½" squares



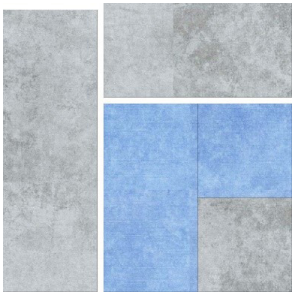

Assembly Instructions

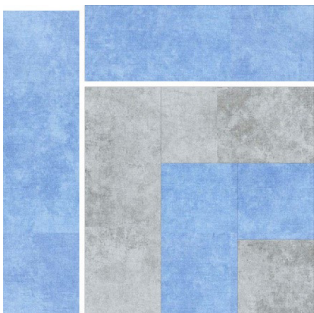
-Lay out a 2 ½" **Fabric 1** square, a 2 ½" **Fabric 2** square, and a 2 ½" x 4 ½" **Fabric 2** rectangle as shown. Sew the squares together first, then sew the rectangle to the side.



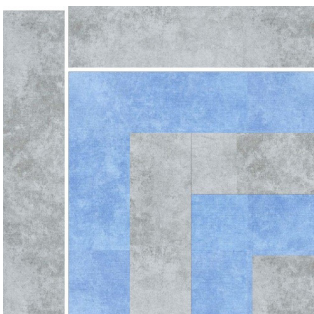
-Lay out the unit from the previous step, a 2 ½" x 4 ½" **Fabric 1** rectangle, and a 2 ½" x 6 ½" **Fabric 1** rectangle as shown. Sew the rectangle to the top first, then to the side.



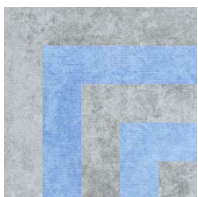
-Lay out the unit from the previous step, a 2 ½" x 6 ½" **Fabric 2** rectangle, and a 2 ½" x 8 ½" **Fabric 2** rectangle as shown. Sew the rectangle to the top first, then to the side.



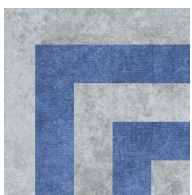
-Lay out the unit from the previous step, a 2 ½" x 8 ½" **Fabric 1** rectangle, and a 2 ½" x 10 ½" **Fabric 1** rectangle as shown. Sew the rectangle to the top first, then to the side.



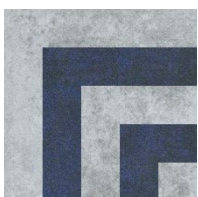
-Block should measure 10 ½" square. Repeat to make **(9)** total blocks with **Fabric 1** and **Fabric 2**.



-Repeat the above steps to make **(16)** total blocks with **Fabric 1** and **Fabric 3**.



-Repeat the above steps to make **(11)** total blocks with **Fabric 1** and **Fabric 4**.



-Using the following **Assembly Diagram**, lay out the **(36)** blocks as shown, rotating as needed. Sew together into rows, then sew rows together.

-Layer with batting and backing fabric and quilt as desired.
